Personal Transportation Vehicles

The City of Monroe recently adopted a city ordinance that allows residents to register and operate Personal Transportation Vehicles (PTV) on city streets. This ordinance allows those who register the ability to operate PTVs on city streets, recreational paths, rights-of-way, and other public property which are part of the city's street system. Anyone desiring to register a Personal Transportation Vehicle (PTV) should visit the Code Department at City Hall.

Airport

The City of Monroe is proud to own and operate its own airport located in the southeast portion of the city at the end of Towler Street. Whether flying through on business or taking aviation classes, the City of Monroe airport offers a variety of services.

The airport is the home of one of Georgia's largest sport parachute operations and is home to a glider club. The City's airport also boasts its own fuel farm allowing those who travel in and through our city to refuel before their next take-off. The City's airport even provides private hangar services, land leases, and tie down services.

The City of Monroe also encourages citizen engagement as much as possible. We now have our own app that allows citizens to report 311 type issues on your mobile phones, tablets, and computers. This app uses GPS to identify your location and gives you a list of quality-of-life conditions to select for reporting.

The app also allows you to take a photo and upload it with your service request. After a request is submitted, our city staff will get the issue resolved as soon as possible. The progress of each service request can be tracked in-app so you'll even know when the problem has been fixed.

History / Culture / Music / Arts

Monroe became known as the county seat of Walton County in 1820 and was incorporated in 1821. Monroe has since been known as one of Georgia's most civil-minded and cultured smaller cities, proudly claiming the honor of being the "City of Governors," as seven Georgia Governors called Monroe home. Monroe is also famous for being the home of the Monroe Girls Corps. The Girls Corps was a precision drum and bugle marching group that were the highlight of every football game halftime show from the 1950s to 1980s. There were nationally renowned, playing at Carnegie Hall and repeatedly in the Macy's Day Parade. To learn more about the Girls Corps and our rich local history, visit the Monroe Museum and Visitors Center located in the Historic City Hall building at 227S. Broad Street. Another landmark worth a visit is the Monroe Walton Center for the Arts, located at 205 S. Broad Street in a beautifully restored post office built in 1931. Drop for inspiration from local artists or a creative class. For theatre arts, On Stage Walton will delight and satisfy. The community theatre is located in a historic church structure at 215 High School Avenue. Throughout the year On Stage produces multiple plays, musicals and youth theatre workshops. Their shows usually sell out, so be sure to get your tickets early!
